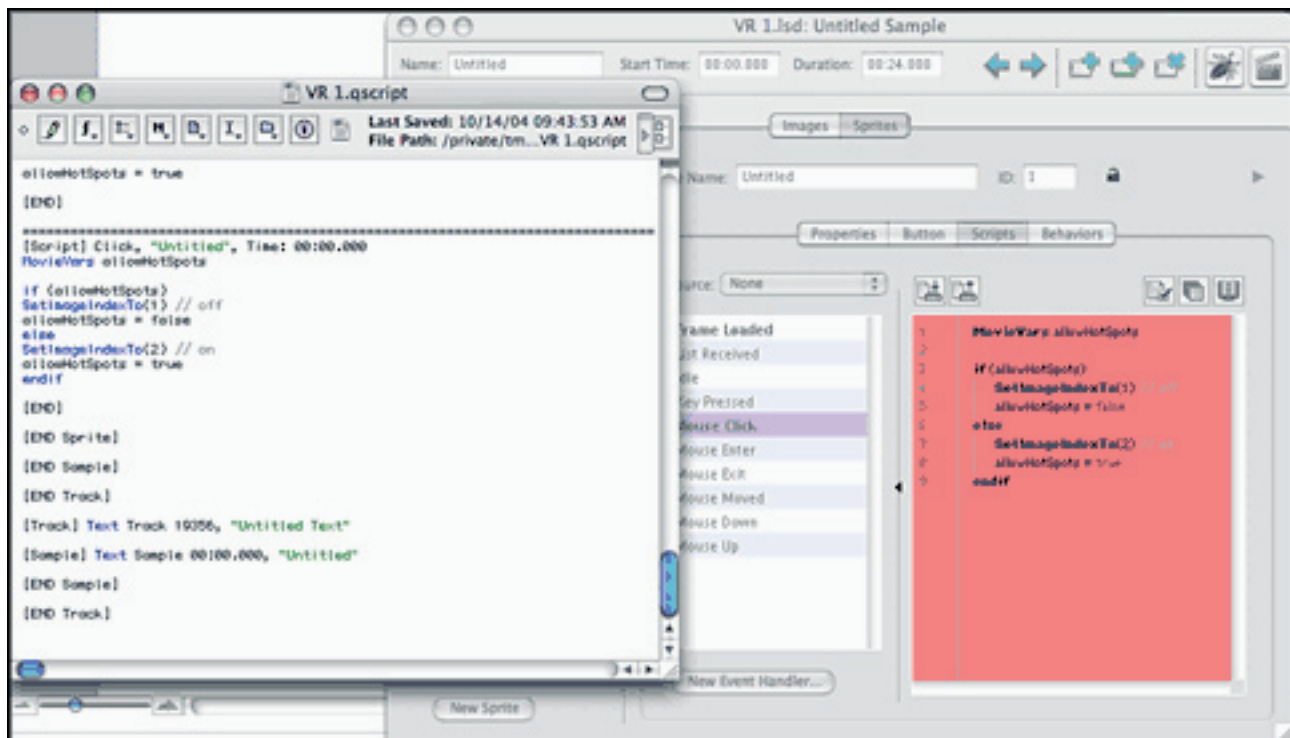
LiveStage and BBEdit

LiveStage takes advantage of the Codeless language modules functionality added in BBEdit 8.0 to add syntax coloring support for QScripts. QScripts and LiveStage behaviors opened in BBEdit are now formatted like in LiveStage's internal script editor.

Simply open your QScript files (".qscript") or Behaviors (".lsb") into BBEdit to edit them.

LiveStage Professional 4.5.4 and higher allows developers to edit all the scripting of a project in BBEdit. Simply select "Edit in BBEdit" from the File menu to view and edit your project's scripts in BBEdit. Saving your BBEdit document transfers the modifications done in BBEdit back to LiveStage Pro .

While editing your project's scripts in BBEdit, LSP's internal script editor cannot be modified.
